Spring: This is a Journal of haiku, senryu and haibun with contributors from around the world. Some of the poems have been heard on the Haiku Pea Podcast, but there are a large number of bonus poems, original to this volume. Additionally, in this edition there is a 36 verse renku and an essay on the use of place names in Japanese haiku. **Summer:** In this Journal you will find poems that explore the use of sound and the Japanese aesthetic yūgen. You can read poems in which the poets have removed all traces of their ego. In the chapter on selective realism our poets explore the techniques propounded by the Japanese Master, Masaoka Shiki. Our poets have been looking at the use of the season in haiku. When used in an accomplished manner, it intensifies the emotion our poetry is trying to arouse.
